The goals of the program are reduce the incidence of violent and antisocial behaviors among youth, increase self-esteem, increase school/education engagement, and improve pro-social plans for the future. CASA recruits, trains and supervises volunteers who advocate on behalf of abused and neglected children in the Essex County Juvenile Courts (Lawrence, Newburyport, Salem & Lynn). Volunteers are appointed as the Guardian ad Litem on complex "care and protection" cases, usually taking only one case at a time to advocate for the children's best interests in court.

AMIGOS Mentoring

Amigos matches youth, ages 8-14, with two staff mentors who create trusting relationships that enhance protective factors associated with youth violence prevention, such as school engagement, social connections, and external supports. Mentors will meet with youth once a week for 3 hours and receive a stipend for their time.

Students are transported to our partners once a week to work on homework, MCAS prep, AP coursework and college readiness. High School seniors also work on college transition planning.
