MEETING BASIC NEEDS COMES FIRST

Family Services' **Family & Community Resource Center** (FCRC), located at One Union Street in Lawrence, is committed to helping families thrive. To do that, the FCRC provides vital basic needs such as clothing, baby care items, and nutrition assistance to families so that they have the capacity to pursue other goals like securing housing, jobs, and education for their kids.

To help us meet those basic needs, Family Services' recently received an amazing donation of clothing essentials from **Cradles to Crayons**, Boston. They delivered: 80 cases of diapers, 52 bundles of clothes, and boxes of children's books – all of which are being distributed to families in need.

In addition to the provision of basic needs, Family Services' FCRC also provides parent education classes, after-school groups for teens, playgroups, and support groups. Services are free and available to anyone living in Essex County. See contact info below to find out more.

New Support Groups Coming Soon

In its effort to reduce the incidence of suicide and support suicide loss survivors in Massachusetts, Family Services' Samaritans program is initiating new and expanded support groups.

Coming Soon...

- **Suicide Loss Survivor Virtual Support Group**
"Safe Place" will be a virtual drop-in group that is peer-led, free, and confidential for adults (18+) who have lost a loved one to suicide. This group provides a safe place to grieve and receive support after a loss.

This virtual Safe Place group supplements the existing in-person group, which meets on the 2nd & 4th Tuesday of each month from 7:00-8:30 p.m. at Saint Michael Parish in North Andover. Prior registration is not required.

- **Suicide Attempt Survivor Support Group**
This peer-led virtual support group offers a safe, non-judgmental space for individuals with a history of a suicide attempt to share their thoughts and feelings, connecting with others who have similar lived experiences. *Pre-registration for this group is required.*
- **LGBTQIA+ Support Group**
Recognizing the unique circumstances and mental health challenges faced by the LGBTQIA+ community, the Samaritans will be offering a new virtual peer support group for adult (18+) members of the LGBTQIA+ community. This free, confidential space will be held for attendees to share challenges and coping strategies, and find community with peers.

All groups are free, confidential, and peer-led. Groups will meet bi-weekly (2x/month) on dates and times to be determined by participants. Anyone interested should use the contact information at right to share interest and suggest dates and times.



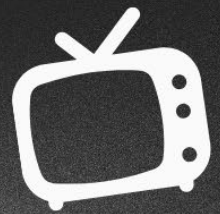

YOU have a role in saving a life.

To learn how you can support young people in crisis and prevent suicide, register for Family Services' next QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) training.

QPR is a 1.5-hour training designed to teach adults who regularly interact with young people about the warning signs of a suicide crisis and equip them with simple tools to respond.

Trainings are open to anyone with an interest in helping young people and are delivered via Zoom.
